We are looking for staff and faculty who share our belief that a culturally rich and inclusive school community provides students with the best possible environment for a quality education. - Teaches 4 class periods per week of Grade 9 Spanish in a culturally and linguistically immersive environment
- Develops engaging curriculum to meet the needs of Grade 9 students
- Collaborates with World Language Department Chair in curriculum development and teaching practices
- Plans and leads appropriate field trips
- Keeps records and writes reports according to current school guidelines
- Attends weekly Department Meetings, High School Faculty Meetings, Full Faculty meetings as scheduled and In-Service/PD days
- Models a culture of flexible, continuous learning for students and colleagues
- Establishes and cultivates community relations by maintaining open and candid dialogue with all of the school's constituencies
- Complies and is familiar with all policies and regulations as put forth in the school's documents
- Engages vigorously in professional development through teacher in-services, Preview Days, Review Days, and conferences as determined in conversation with the Pedagogical Chair
- Takes all necessary and reasonable precautions to protect students, faculty, staff, equipment, materials, and facilities since safety and security are everyone's responsibility
- Performs other duties as assigned

- Strong organizational skills
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- Ability to work with and support students of all abilities including students with accommodations

- Possessing a level of cultural competency necessary for working with a diverse population in an inclusive and equitable community
